# Fire Prevention Week

It's the fire service's annual fire prevention week and time to push our public education efforts to the forefront in our communities. Take this as a true *opportunity* to reduce fires and injuries due to fires. Following local and nationally adopted guidelines for public education messages, review the application of these to your community and plan to complete company level educational efforts during this week. This should be a year-round focus but we'll take what we can get.

**Company Level Fire Prevention Activities**

1. Perform fire safety surveys in private dwellings to identify fire and life-safety hazards
2. Present fire safety information to station visitors or small groups on fire and life-safety messages.
3. Prepare pre-incident surveys of identified occupancies to identify items of concern and to familiarize
